Location:

Nestled in a serene valley, NCST offers an inspiring environment for learning. Its campus, with modern amenities, was formally inaugurated on May 24, 2008, by Hon. R.L. Bhatia, then Governor of Kerala. The college is located at Kannath-Veettichola, about a kilometre from Karuvarakundu-Kizhakkethala Bus Stand.

Management:

The institution is governed by Darunnajath Islamic Centre, a registered organisation holding Minority Status granted by the National Commission for Minority Educational Institutions, Government of India. 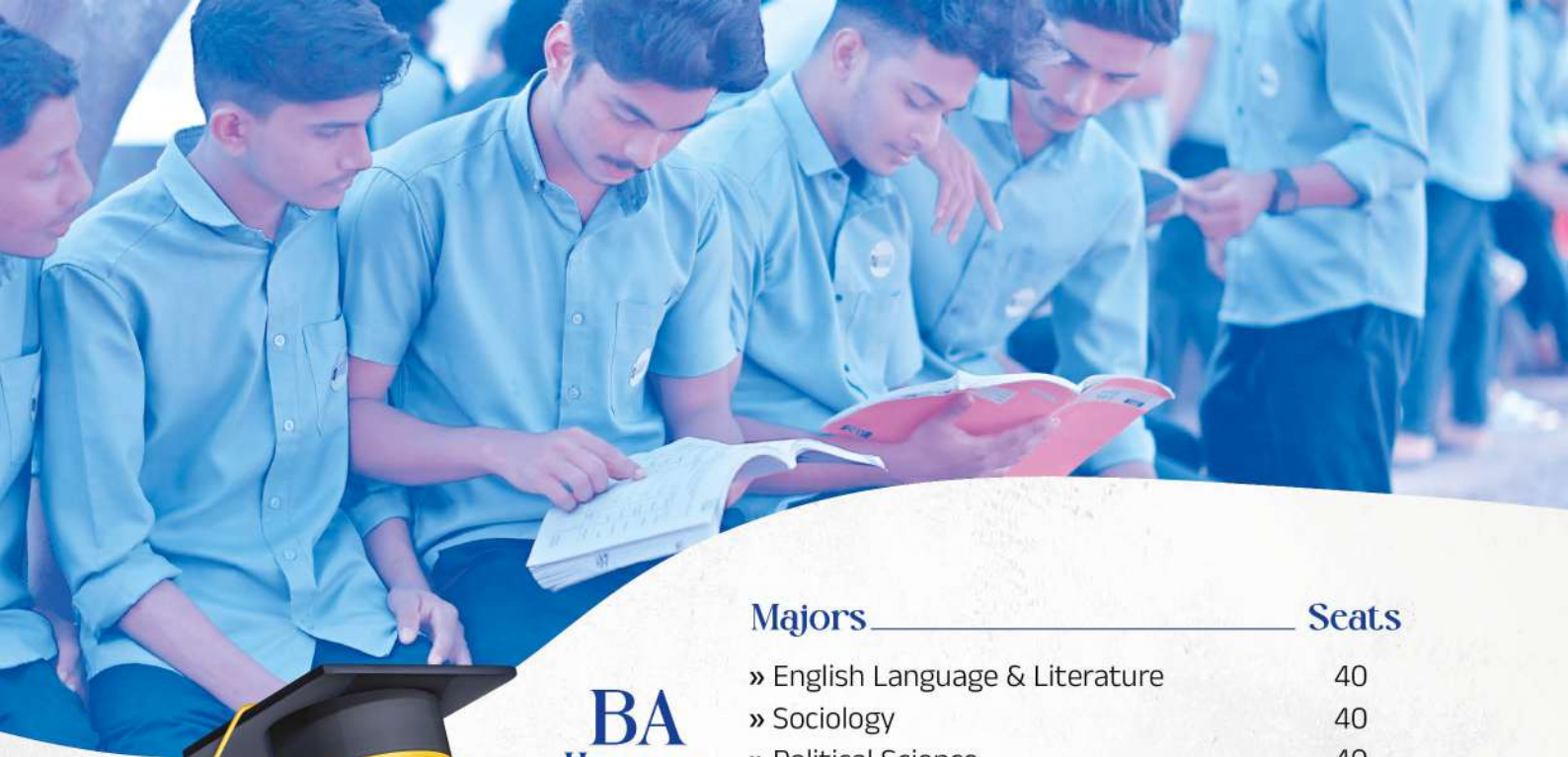

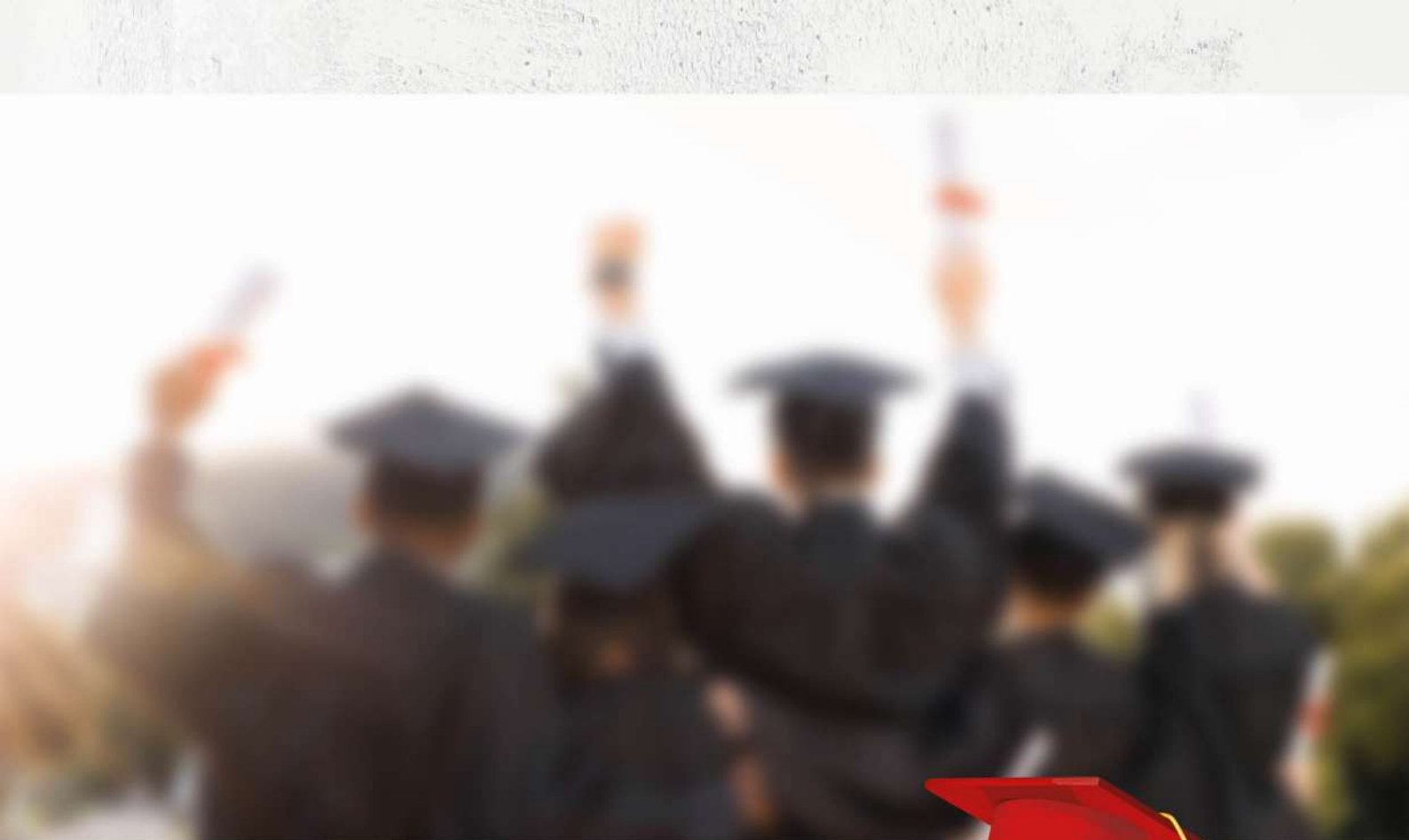

Eligibility For FYUG Admission

- » Candidates Eligible for Higher Studies as per the Higher Secondary Examination or its equivalent may apply.
- » **B.A. English, BA. Sociology, BA. Political Science, BA. Journalism & Mass Communication:-** HSE or equivalent qualification.
- » **BCom:-** HSE or equivalent with at least one commerce subject. Others need a minimum of 45% marks. OBC/OEC candidates get a 5% concession; SC/ST candidates need only a pass.
- » **BBA:-** HSE or equivalent with at least 45% marks. OBC/OEC candidates receive a 5% concession; SC/ST candidates need only a pass.

Eligibility for PG Admissions

- » **M.Com Finance:-** B.Com/ BBA degree (or equivalent) with a minimum of 45% aggregate marks (50% for Honours/Professional degrees). OBC/OEC candidates get a 5% relaxation; SC/ST candidates need only a pass.
 - » **M.A. English:-** BA in English-related subjects or any BA/BSc degree with English as a common course, with at least 45% marks. OBC/OEC candidates get a 5% relaxation; SC/ST candidates need only a pass.
- Non-BA (English) applicants:** Admission through an Entrance Test conducted by University of Calicut with minimum 50% marks.

Admission Process

Admissions for the UG & PG programmes are conducted as per the schedule of the University of Calicut. Single Window Registration is mandatory for both Management and Merit Admissions.

Admission Guidelines

- » **Seat Allocation:-** 50% of seats are filled through University CAP, while the remaining 50% fall under the Management Quota.
- » **Management Quota Admission:-** Forms are available at the college office for ₹150. Applicants must submit the form with an online submission printout.
- » **Online Application:-** Forms for Management Quota can be accessed and submitted via the <https://ncst.embase.in/admission/>
- » **Course Preferences:-** Applicants must carefully select their additional language and rank their preferred core subjects.
- » **Eligibility Compliance:-** Management ensures candidates meet the prescribed eligibility criteria for admission.
- » **Merit-Based Seat Distribution:-** The remaining 50% of seats follow university guidelines, detailed in the table below.
- » **Interview Requirement:-** A parent or guardian must accompany the student during the admission
- » Candidates should produce the following certificates at the time of interview:
 1. College Application Form.
 2. College copy of the CAP registration.
 3. Receipt of the Mandatory Fee paid to the University of Calicut.
 4. +2 Mark list (Original + 2 Copies).
 5. SSLC or equivalent certificate (Original + 1 Copy).
 6. Transfer Certificate & Conduct Certificate (Original).
 7. Equivalency Certificate & Migration Certificate (for students from outside Kerala /NIOS).
 8. Nativity, Community and Income/Non-Creamy Layer Certificate (for reservation seat).
 9. Medical Board Certificate (for physically challenged candidates).
 10. Sports & Games Certificate (for admission under sports quota).
 11. Certificates for Bonus/Weightage marks.
 12. Two copies of recent Passport-Size Photograph.
 13. One copy of the Aadhaar Card.
 14. Qualifying Degree Certificates & Mark Lists for P.G. admission (Original + 4 Copies).
 15. Bonafide certificate from the university concerned for PG admission (for students from outside Kerala).

General Rules

- » Discipline: Students must maintain a high standard of discipline within the college.
- » Attendance: Punctuality and regular attendance are mandatory. A minimum of 75% attendance is required to be eligible for university exams.
- » Leave & Condonation: Absence without submitting a leave form results in removal from the rolls. Students with less than 75% attendance must obtain University condonation to appear for exams.
- » Ragging: Strictly prohibited as per directives from the Supreme Court, High Court, UGC, Government of Kerala, and the University of Calicut. It is a criminal offence punishable by imprisonment up to two years, a fine, or both. An Anti-Ragging Cell is active in the college.
- » Cell phones: Use of mobile phones within the campus is strictly banned as per the Kerala High Court directive.
- » Campus Property: Students must handle college property with care and refrain from defacing walls, furniture, or windows.
- » Classroom Conduct: Loitering during class hours and unauthorized entry into other classrooms is prohibited.

- » Behaviour: Indecent conduct toward staff or fellow students will result in disciplinary action.
- » Dress Code: Students must adhere to the prescribed dress code.

Uniform :- Mandatory on designated days.

Attire :- Clothing should be clean, modest, and dignified.

Restrictions :- Male students must not wear T-shirts. Female students must avoid low-neck, short or sleeveless blouses, mini-skirts, tight or short tops, tops with slits, or transparent clothing. College authorities will determine the standards of modesty and decorum.
