

# Anti-Narcotic Cell

The Anti-Narcotic cell of the college has been constituted as per the order of Govt. of Kerala GO(MS)No 205/2013/Nov, TVM dt 09/12/2013 to ensure a drug-free campus by imposing a total ban on the possession or use of drugs and alcohol by students of the college, within or outside the campus. It aims at working against the use of alcohol, tobacco drugs and other narcotic items.

## Moto of the Anti-Narcotic Cell

- **SAY YES TO LIFE, NO TO DRUGS**

## Objectives

- To impose a strict ban on the possession or use of narcotic items on campus.
- To engage the students in anti-narcotic activities in their life.
- To enhance the student's awareness and understanding of the harmful social and health effects of illicit drug use.
- To motivate the student community to actively participate in awareness programmes conducted by the cell
- To provide counselling sessions for students who display tendencies towards such drug or alcohol/ narcotic use.

## The functions & Responsibilities

- Organizing awareness programmes in the college and premises with the help of government/ authorized/volunteer agencies/ organizations.
- Educating the students about the ill effects of drugs and alcohol, and encouraging peer policing among students against the use of drugs.
- Organizes seminars, campaigns and rallies, against the use of tobacco and drugs in the College and its vicinity.
- The cell officials keep close contact with the excise and police departments and arrange programs to make the students aware of the strong legal force working against narcotics.
- Anti- Narcotic cell can conduct programs along with other clubs and forums to create awareness of the ill effects of the use of drugs among the student community – Poster presentations, Street Plays, Distribution of Flyers, and Celebrating days associated with the theme can be encouraged
- Ensuring no sale of tobacco/narcotic products inside and on the premises of the campus.
- Provide counselling sessions whenever it is required.

## The composition of Narcotic Cell

The Anti-Narcotic Cell consists of the following members:

1. Principal: As the Chairman of the Cell, the principal will provide overall guidance and support to the cell's activities.
2. Coordinator: A Coordinator will be deputed from the college council to oversee and organize the operations of the Anti-Narcotic Cell.

3. Three faculties from the staff council: These faculty members will represent the staff's perspective and contribute to the cell's efforts in combating narcotics.
4. Two students (one boy and one girl) from each department: These students will serve as representatives of their respective departments and contribute to the cell's initiatives from a student's point of view.
5. Union Chairman: The Union Chairman is likely the head of the students' union or a similar student organization, representing the collective interests of the students.
6. A male and a female member from the Parent-Teacher Association (PTA): These members will represent the views and concerns of parents and teachers in the cell's activities.
7. Representative of the Department of Excise: This member is likely a government official from the Department of Excise, bringing in expertise and support from the government's side in tackling narcotic issues.

The Anti-Narcotic Cell's composition includes individuals from various stakeholders, enabling a collaborative approach to address the challenges posed by narcotics within the college or educational institution. This multi-member setup ensures a comprehensive approach to tackling the issue, involving students, staff, parents, and government authorities.
